

Senate Bill 114 Mandates Dyslexia Screening in California

The Education Omnibus Budget Trailer Bill (SB 114) will require California schools to implement universal K–2 screening for reading delays, including the risk of dyslexia. Local education agencies (LEAs) will begin annual screening by the 2025–2026 school year. The bill states that **early identification and intervention with evidence-based early literacy instructional strategies and materials improves literacy outcomes.**
