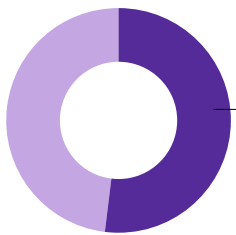


North Carolina District Achieves EOG Results With Lexia Core5

Accessible Interventions

A large suburban school district in North Carolina found the answer to accessible reading interventions that lead to positive End-of-Grade (EOG) Reading results: Lexia® Core5® Reading. When using Core5 during the 2022–2023 school year, the EOG performance of students in grades 3–5 correlated with their end-of-year level in the science of reading-based program.
