

California ELD Proficiency Bands and Lexia English Levels

The California Department of Education designed California English Language Development Standards (CA ELD) to describe the knowledge, skills, and abilities that students who are learning English as a new language are expected to exhibit upon exit from each proficiency level. These Proficiency Level Descriptors (PLDs) are used throughout the school year as a language development continuum of increasing proficiency in language learning. The three levels represent the stages of English language development and are in direct correlation to the lesson levels in Lexia® English Language Development™. Lexia English lessons are developed for California students, by California educators, to accurately depict the language development continuum designed by the California Department of Education.
