A Special Assignment

As a teacher on special assignment in the Laguna Beach Unified School District, Yadhira Rojas was tasked with evaluating the English language learning program in the district's elementary schools, middle school, and high school. The district needed to find a better way to support its Emergent Bilingual students, who represent approximately 3% of the district's students. District leaders also wanted a program that would reinforce teacher-led instruction during English language learning time.

"Our students don't do enough speaking," Rojas explained, "particularly at home where English is not the primary language." The district had been using technology solutions for students, but there was nothing in place specifically focused on

language development. Rojas reviewed Lexia English Language Development™ and liked its focus on academic language and speaking practice. Tracking Progress and Results

For Laguna Beach, Lexia English supported teachers nearly as much as it supported students. The program's patented Assessment Without Testing® technology gathered and analyzed actionable, real-time progressmonitoring data, offering reports that "allow us to show parents that their kids are making progress," said Rojas.

The data reflects students' real-time progress, providing teachers with targeted offline lessons and usage reports. This helps teachers target instruction appropriately and better engage each student. Rojas also valued the high-level reporting for school and district leaders. "I can see the results for an entire year with just one click," she explained.

By the end of the school year, Rojas was excited to see her students' increased linguistic

confidence, as evidenced by the likelihood that students would speak in class. This would serve them well on the state proficiency test. Lexia English is aligned with multiple state language proficiency standards to support language acquisition for students at all proficiency levels. Of particular importance to Laguna Beach is the alignment to the California English Language Development Standards. According to Rojas, that really set the program apart.
