


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The Value of Professional Learning for Literacy Instruction



LETRS in Action

One school district saw remarkable progress after educators participated in LETRS. Teachers who participated in the professional learning were "blown away by how much we did not know" and wondered why they had not learned literacy fundamentals in college. Before implementing LETRS, 60% of fourth-grade students scored below proficient in reading. After? The scores for sixth grade showed 86% of students were proficient overall—at or above benchmark.

LETRS in Action

For one district, balanced literacy wasn't working—students weren't where they needed to be, especially in phonemic awareness.

They wanted to shift to the science of reading approach, and initially implemented LETRS for a cohort of 44 educators. Teachers loved the program, and students thrived under the new instruction. Since then, the district has launched a second and third cohort, and is expanding to K–3 teachers. In addition, the district plans to train all preschool educators in using LETRS for Early Childhood Educators.

In one district where students were struggling with reading, a districtwide instructional coach identified a lack of understanding and pedagogical knowledge of the science of reading as a cause. In just eight weeks after implementing LETRS, the percentage of first-through third-grade students in remediation decreased from 34% to 23%.
